WHOLESALE'S OFFICIAL SUSPICIOUS ORDER REPORTING FORM

This report is being provided pursuant to C.F.R. §1301.74(b) and West Virginia State Rules § 15-2-4.4 requirements for drug distributors to identify and report controlled substance or, if applicable, precursor chemical orders that are suspicious. The suspicious order monitoring system designed and operated by the wholesaler listed below (item 14) detects and stops orders before they reach a volume or display a pattern that is indicative of diversion. These systems are proactive and many orders reported as suspicious are not likely to be diverted. However, if an order does not meet the stringent criteria for being released, the order is stopped and reported even though there is no information available to the wholesaler indicating that the customer has diverted controlled substances.
